

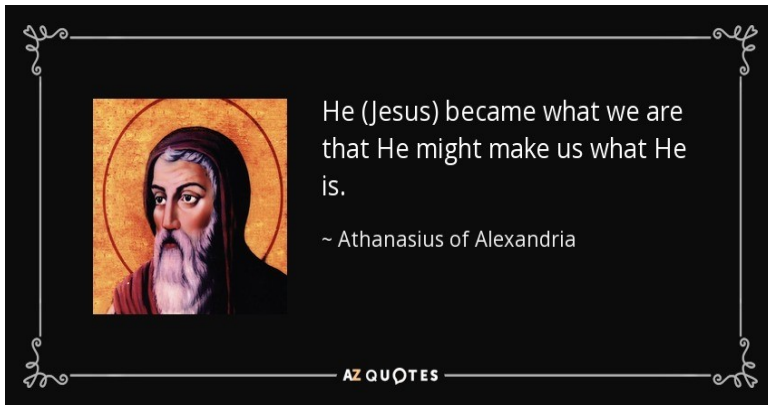
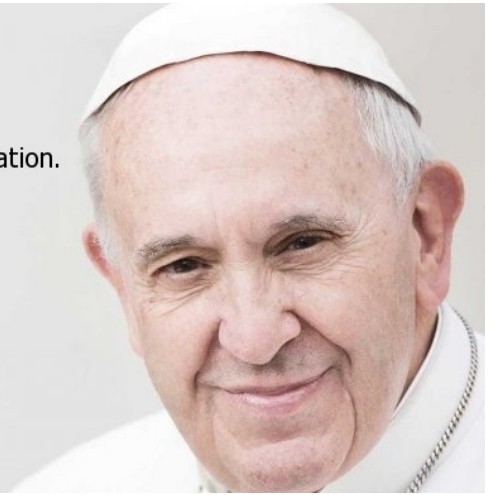
THINK ABOUT INCARNATION

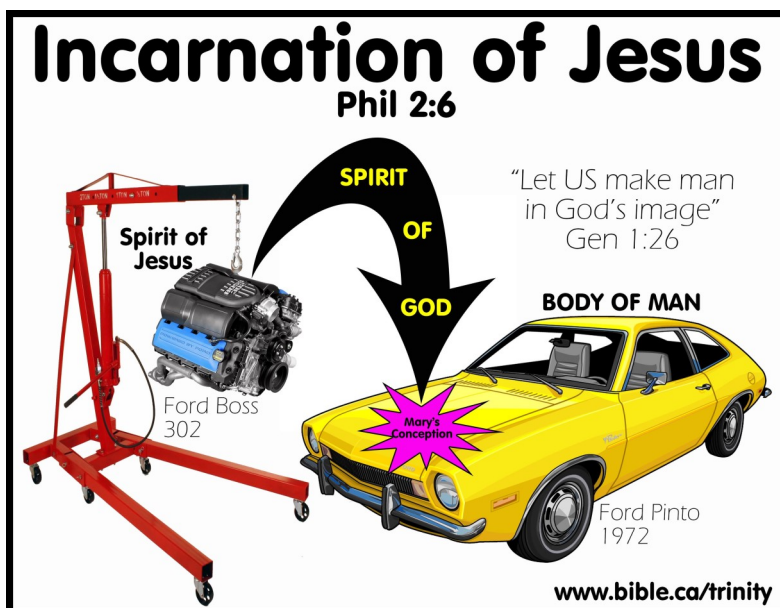
